### LEGAL BASES

- Section 4, Article XIII of Republic Act No. 11054 also known as the Bangsamoro Organic Law (BOL) provides for the creation of the Bangsamoro Economic and Development Council (BEDC) to serve as planning, monitoring and coordinating agency of the Bangsamoro Government.
- Section 3 of Bangsamoro Autonomy Act (BAA) No. 6 establishes the BEDC to serve as the socio-economic planning, monitoring and coordinating agency for all development plans, programs and projects of the Bangsamoro Government.
- Section 15 of BAA No. 13 or the Bangsamoro Administrative Code mandates the BEDC to monitor and evaluate all development programs and projects implemented by the national government, Bangsamoro ministries/line agencies/offices (BMOAs), local government units (LGUs), and government owned and/or controlled corporations (GOCCs) in the BARMM.
- Rule VI, Section 5 of BEDC Resolution No. 1 Series of 2020 created the BEDC Special Committees to assist the Council on special concerns, which include the Regional Project Monitoring and Evaluation Committee (RPMECom).


# The Regional Project Monitoring and Evaluation Committee (RPMECom)

The **RPMECom** is a special committee of the BEDC mandated to monitor all development programs/projects implemented by the BMOAs, LGUs, and GOCCs in the BARMM.

These projects may be funded by the National Government with or without foreign assistance or financed purely by the Bangsamoro Government or from local revenues of its component LGUs. These include the following:

- 1. Projects under the General Appropriations Act of the Bangsamoro (GAAB) and other special funds intended for the BARMM;
- 2. Projects which comprise the approved National Infrastructure Program with component in the BARMM;
- 3. Projects undertaken by GOCCs; with subsidy or equity contribution from the Bangsamoro government; and
- 4. Projects implemented by LGUs, with budgetary assistance from the Bangsamoro Government.


# The Bangsamoro Results-Based M&E Framework Manual of Operations

- The **BRBMEF Manual of Operations** is crafted for sustainable and thriving environments for the Bangsamoro Autonomous Region in Muslim Mindanao program which is being implemented in all sectors. To ensure that information needed to manage and adjust the program is available, a monitoring and evaluation system is being set up to cover all levels, from community to regional.
- This manual describes specific information on planning, organizing, carrying out, and reporting on the M&E activities. A set of matrices and detailed indicator datasheets specific to gain access for the investors and stakeholders. Preparing this manual drew upon a wide range of other manuals and guidelines prepared by multilateral agencies funding development projects across all sectors, including foreign-funded organizations.

#### Specifically, the manual aims to:

- 1. Provide operational guidelines for the integration, coordination and linkage of all monitoring and evaluation activities in the BARMM;
- 2. Provide up-to-date information on the overall status of project implementation at the regional and local levels for planning and budget allocation, including employment generation of the various programs and projects;
- 3. Facilitate the identification of problems/issues that hamper the project implementation for remedial actions at the regional and local levels and to elevate unresolved issues and problems at the national level for the projects funded by the national government or Official Development Assistance (ODA) with a component for BARMM;
- 4. Institutionalize problem-solving sessions as a mechanism to address issues and concerns related to the implementation of programs and projects;
- 5. Provide information on lessons learned in project implementation for planning and implementation of future similar projects;
- 6. Assess and ascertain whether projects implemented are supportive of the Bangsamoro development thrusts and priorities; and,
- 7. Provide a venue for greater participation of non-government organizations (NGOs) and other relevant stakeholders in the development progress of the BARMM.




